2. <u>Guest Speakers</u> – HSIE KLA: Peter Hartman & Nick Fernandez

Focus on students doing the best they can do. Whilst there are challenges with AI, it does not replace the value of what they are learning. There are a wide range of skills that students learn and improve in studying these subject, that prepare them for the real world, adopting new methods and platforms to engage students.

We exist in a culture of high expectations and have students who are learning to work hard. The courses teach them skills that are key transferable skills including literacy, communication, entrepreneurship, data interpretation, building empathetic understanding and critical thinking to name a few. Sometimes, students do not consider the skills that the content provides. As a KLA, the teachers are teaching and building value into their programs and have to sell the value to students.

The courses offer outside of the classroom opportunities, extensive initiatives. Accelerated Aboriginal studies, provides 2 camps to learn more and are supported by a range of networks. The wins on best student for Aboriginal Studies speaks largely of the effort and how students can excel in courses in the KLA.

1. What is the update of students of successes of Legal Studies in Stage 6.

Answer Nick Fernandez: is a Senior Marker in Stage 6 courses and have consistently achieved results. There are 2 classes this year in Stage 6, and is a consistent to the usual number of classes and expecting excellent results.
